The RIVERS Women's Initiative also conducts community forums and trainings to bridge the gap between communities of color and their institutions of faith on the topics of sexual trauma.

Melinda Johnson has worked for organizations like the Urban League of Greater Hartford and Connecticut Women's Education and Legal Fund in efforts to implement solution based programming and advocacy to dismantle localized economic disparities and social inequities for women and girls. Most recently, Melinda was appointed to the Permanent Commission of the Status of Hartford Women under the mayoral administration of Luke Bronin, where she devotes her time and talent to exploring and resolving issues of inequity for Hartford residents. Currently Melinda serves as the Director for Community Engagement and Advocacy for the YWCA Hartford Region amplifying the mission of the YWCA to empower women and eliminate racism.
